4.3	% of eligible persons provided with Disability Pension	The beneficiary shall be in age group of 18-79 years and belongs to a household living below Poverty Line. The applicant should be suffering from severe or multiple disabilities as defined in persons with Disabilities Act, 1995 (PWD Act 1995) and the National Trust for the Welfare of Persons with Autism, Cerebral Palsy, Mental Retardation and Multiple Disabilities, Act, 1999(National Trust Act 1999) as revised from time to time and any other guidelines issued by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment.

5.3	% of households living in Kachcha/Unsafe houses	Under the PMAY-G, all households that are houseless and living in 0, 1 and 2 kutchha wall and kutchha roof houses as per SECC, 2011 are eligible.

6.2	% of households having electricity connection	Under the Pradhan Mantri Sahaj Bijli Har Ghar Yojana (SAUBHAGYA), free electricity connection to all APL and BPL family.
6.3	% of households using at least one LED bulb	Open to all household who have electricity connection in their house.
6.4	% of households having gas connection	All BPL family as per SECC, 2011 are eligible.
